On-Campus Opportunities

Summer Pharmacy Institute (June 5-9, 2017) – The Summer Pharmacy Institute (SPI) allows students to explore different areas of the pharmacy profession, including a full day workshop devoted to current trends, research, and activities in each of the following focus areas: Hospital, Ambulatory Care, Industry/Research & Development, Community, and Professionalism in the Field. SPI attendees are typically on site from 9-4 PM each day. The last day of the institute is a half-day. The cost is \$100.

AERA Undergraduate Research Training Workshop – This workshop is designed to build the talent pool of undergraduate students who plan to pursue doctorate degrees in education research or in disciplines and fields that examine education issues. Applicants are sought who have potential and interest in pursuing careers as education researchers, faculty members, or other professionals who contribute to the research field. The workshop, led by junior and senior scholars, will give fellows an overview of how education research is designed across fields, how quantitative and qualitative research methods are used in studies, and how research is applied to education policy and practice.

UIC Bridges to Baccalaureate Program – The program offers students an intensive summer research skills workshop, an assigned research mentor, access to peer-tutors, and support for science and academic skill development through cohort activities including participation at a national health science conference. Students selected for the program begin preparation to bridge to UIC's baccalaureate programs in nursing, public health, or liberal arts and sciences at the conclusion of their second year at participating community colleges.

The Engaged Research Fellowship (TERF) – The Engaged Research Fellowship, supports undergraduate COE students in conducting focused, faculty-mentored research connected to social justice. This fellowship emphasizes applied research, highlighting research that does justice, such as research on justice-related issues, research with community-based organizations, and/or research in response to pressing social issues. Each year, up to 5 fellowships will be awarded.

UIC Honors College Undergraduate Research Assistant (URA) – Honors College students who have completed their freshman year can participate formally in faculty research as a way of satisfying the honors activity requirement. UIC has a wealth of outstanding researchers, and the Undergraduate Research Assistant Program gives honors students an opportunity to work with some of them. The range of research activity is wide, including business, education, engineering, the humanities and the arts, the natural sciences and mathematics, and the social sciences. Undergraduate Research Assistants are expected to put in approximately six hours a week on a project that is part of, or relevant to, the faculty member's research.

Career Development Fellowship Program – Full-time second semester freshmen are eligible to participate. It is designed to increase success at UIC through on-campus student employment, career exploration, and professional training and mentoring. Students are paid to work on campus for up to 15 hours per week at a rate of \$10/hour, attend career-development seminars and trainings, and receive career support.

APA Summer Science Fellowship – An expenses-paid, intensive summer training program, the SSF places up to 12 talented students in the psychology laboratories of some of the most outstanding researchers in the Washington, D.C., area. The lab experience will be six weeks in length. The SSF program gives students an opportunity to explore the intellectual, personal and social processes of scientific inquiry and to experience cutting-edge psychological research through hands-on laboratory activities. SSF offers promising students the opportunity to equip themselves with skills essential to succeed in graduate school, and gives students who plan to pursue advanced degrees in psychological science the opportunity to be mentored by nationally known faculty.

Multidisciplinary Oral Science Training Program (MOST) – The MOST Summer Program provides unique research experiences to qualified undergraduate students. Participants work with faculty mentors to design and conduct a research project. Areas of research include: wound and tissue regeneration, developmental biology, bioengineering, biomaterials, cancer biology, microbiology and immunology. Students will also participate in regular seminars and other larger group activities, as well as prepare for presentation of their research.

Summer Research Opportunities Program (SROP) – Students receive an award of up to \$4,000 to work with talented faculty at a Research 1 institution with state-of-the-art facilities. That experience includes instruction in research development which prepares students for the demands of graduate study. They also learn how to apply for admissions and financial support for graduate school. In addition, SROP students are offered opportunities to present their research projects twice during the summer calendar. Sophomores and Juniors from underrepresented ethnic minority groups are invited to apply.

Summer Diabetes Research Program – is a ten-week summer internship for undergraduates with a focus on diabetes research. The program is sponsored by the NIH NIDDK R25 training program, UIC Department of Surgery, UIC Department of Bioengineering and UIC Honors College. Students will be compensated with a \$3,000 stipend over the course of the ten-week program.

Summer Undergraduate Research Fellow Award (SURF) – Summer program for undergraduate students interested in biomedical research. Students will work on independent research projects in the laboratories of their faculty mentors. In addition to individual mentoring, the program offers number of enrichment activities: research seminars, advanced research instrumentation workshops, career day at a local pharmaceutical company, instructions on how to prepare a scientific presentation, practice talks and a mini-symposium where all the participants present their research projects in front of the College audience. SURF participants will receive a compensation of \$3,000 for the 10-week period.

American Society for Microbiology Undergraduate Research Fellowship (ASM) – The ASM Undergraduate Research Fellowship (URF) is aimed at highly competitive students who wish to pursue graduate careers (Ph. D. or M.D./Ph.D.) in microbiology. Students will have the opportunity to conduct full time research at their home institutions with an ASM member and present research results at ASM Microbe the following year. Students will conduct a research project for a minimum of 10 weeks beginning in the summer of 2017, work with faculty mentors who are ASM members and who are employed at the students' home institutions, and submit a research abstract for presentation at the 2018 ASM Microbe Meeting.

Research Training and Career Development Program (RTCP) – The Research Training and Career Development Program (RTCP) is an intensive eight-week summer program for highly motivated undergraduate and graduate students who are interested in exploring potential careers in the

health sciences, and to familiarize them with biomedical research and practice opportunities. Participants will be exposed to issues related to health disparities and health equity, and the impact these have on patient care, health promotion, and prevention. Participants will also participate in a 3-day orientation to enhance their professional skills and acclimate them to a research setting. Additionally, program participants will be offered workshops and activities designed to guide them through the admissions process for graduate or professional school.

Summer Undergraduate Research Program on Health Disparities (SURPHD) – This program provides research opportunities to third and fourth year undergraduate Hispanic students. This 10-week summer research program aims to improve the quality of health care by providing students with practical knowledge of research studies and its importance in the medical field. Through this program, undergraduates are matched with UIC researchers who are studying minority health disparities such as diabetes, cancer, asthma, obesity, and kidney disease. Participants develop the skills to test a hypothesis, interpret preliminary data, and appraise the outcomes of research.

School of Public Health Summer Pre-Matriculation Program – The Pre-Matriculation Program (PMP) is an intensive four-week program coordinated by the Office of Diversity and Inclusion. Enrollment is prioritized for African American, Latino, and Native American students who have been offered admission. The goal of PMP is to strengthen the academic, professional, and social skills of new students as they enter graduate school. PMP curricula and competencies will be delivered in modules, and will be supplemented by professional development and SPH orientation services. Participating students will receive a stipend that will be distributed as modules are satisfactorily completed.

Urban Public Policy Fellowship (UPPF)— UPPF is a leadership development program designed to expose historically underrepresented minority undergraduate students at the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) to key public policy issues. The program provides Fellows with weekly seminars offering a solid introduction to theory and practice in the areas of public policymaking, advocacy, community development, and service provision and also a valuable internship experience. Students from all academic areas are eligible, including those with an interest in fields such as education, urban planning, political science, sociology, urban health, communication, and law. Upperclassman standing (minimum 45 hours) is necessary to participate in this non-degree, non-credit program.

APA Summer Undergraduate Research Opportunity Grants – The APA Summer Undergraduate Research Opportunity Grants will provide undergraduates who have little or no prior laboratory experience with the opportunity to gain first-hand knowledge of how scientific research is conducted. The grants are designed to enable psychology departments to hire undergraduates to work as research assistants in faculty members' labs over the summer of 2016. APA will provide funds to pay each student at the institution's 2016 rate of pay for undergraduate research assistants (but at least \$10 per hour). APA will also make a contribution to the hosting department, with the amount determined by the number of students supported. Research assistants will be temporary employees of the institution, and the institution's employment and other policies will be applicable to them.

ChicagoCHEC Research Fellows Program – The ChicagoCHEC Research Fellows program is a comprehensive learning experience for undergraduate and post-baccalaureate students at Northeastern Illinois University, University of Illinois at Chicago, Northwestern University, and City Colleges of Chicago who are planning to apply to graduate or medical school. This program is focused on the development of academic, technical, and professional skills in preparation for careers in social, behavioral, and biomedical research and in healthcare. ChicagoCHEC Research Fellows will spend the summer in seminars and research rotations learning from leading scientists. Following the summer intensive program, ChicagoCHEC Research Fellows will have the option to be matched with a research mentor and research project during the academic year.

Sigma Xi Grants in Aid Program – This program has provided undergraduate and graduate students with valuable educational experiences since 1922. By encouraging close working relationships between students and mentors, the program promotes scientific excellence and achievement through hands-on learning. The program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to students from all areas of the sciences and engineering. Designated funds from National Academy of Sciences allow for grants of up to \$5,000 for astronomy research and \$2,500 for vision related research. Students use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or for purchase of non-standard laboratory equipment necessary to complete a specific research project.

Field Museum REU Summer Program – The Field Museum REU program will train a cohort of at least eight students in biodiversity-related research in a 10-week summer program. Each participant will undertake an independent research project supervised by a museum scientist in a discipline such as taxonomy and systematics, phylo/ biogeography, paleontology, molecular phylogenetics, or conservation. Students will experience biological diversity through the use of the museum's collections in their research, and will be trained in project-relevant techniques and equipment such as the scanning electron microscope, various light microscopy set-ups, and equipment in the Pritzker DNA lab. A six-week course in phylogenetic systematics run concurrently with intern projects will provide a common theoretical framework for their research. At the conclusion of the summer students will present their research results to their peers and museum scientists at the Undergraduate Research Symposium.

DAAD German Studies Research Grant – This specialized DAAD program offers German Studies Research Grants to highly-qualified undergraduate and graduate students who are nominated by their department/program chairs. The grant may be used for short-term research (one to two months) *in Germany*. Undergraduates with at least junior (third-year) standing pursuing a German Studies track or minor may be nominated for the grant by their department and/or program chair. Applicants are expected to have completed two years of college German and a minimum of three courses in German Studies (literature, history, politics, or other fields) at the time of nomination. Candidates must be citizens or permanent residents of the US and Canada who are enrolled full time at the University that nominated them.

American Psychological Association Undergraduate Research Grants – The purpose of this program is to provide funds for members to defray the cost of conducting a research project. Applicants may request up to \$1,500 for each project. A total of \$45,000 has been allotted for this student grant program; \$22,500 for the November deadline and \$22,500 for the February deadline. All graduate Psi Chi members are eligible to apply for these graduate research grants.
