Where is the research on the transfer student experience?



The Transfer Student: A Snapshot

- During the 2015-2016 academic year, 9 million undergraduate students were enrolled in public two-year institutions. Over 3.9 million of them were enrolled full-time.
- In fall of 2015, over 30 percent of undergraduate students attended two-year colleges. Students at community colleges made up 24 percent of full-time undergraduate students.
- Nearly 50 percent of undergraduate students who graduated in the 2015-2016 academic year had been enrolled in a two-year college within the past decade.

The Challenges Transfer Students Face

- The process of transferring between institutions is influenced by many factors (Hagedorn 2005).
- Barriers to overall success for transfer students include lack of academic preparation, minimal or nonexistent family support, and insufficient financial resources (Dennis et al, 2008; Packard et al, 2012).



The Challenges Transfer Students Face

- The application process is frustrating due to the non-transfer of credits (Townsend, 2008).
- Orientation programs are not always designed to be inclusive of transfer students. These orientation sessions are critical, as they introduce transfer students to an array of services on campus (Gordon, 1992).
- Wang and Wharton discuss how the lack of awareness of support services contributes to lack of usage among transfer students (2012).
- Student engagement with peers and faculty play a significant role in persistence (Astin, 1984; Wang & Wharton 2010).


